


Friday 28 Feb. - Staff Only Day (school is closed)

Uniform Expectations at Glenfield Primary School

In Terms 1 and 4, all students are expected to wear a GPS sunhat when outside. We have a "No Hat, No Play" policy to ensure the safety and well-being of our students.

Black shoes are part of the school uniform and must be worn to and from school. You can choose a style that best suits your childs needs (sandals, lace-up shoes, or buckle shoes), we just ask that they are plain black in colour.

Jewellery is not permitted, excluding a watch, stud earrings, or significant items worn for cultural or reliaious reasons (e.g. a taonga, cross, kautuku/kavala)

Students should wear their full school uniform with pride.

Uniforms should be clean, tidy, and in good repair.
